While two people, a construction worker and a devotee, were confirmed dead on Friday, the death toll rose to four on Saturday after rescue teams recovered more bodies. The New Ahobilam Temple of Protection, situated on a steep hill in Redcliffe in north of eThe-

kwini (formerly Durban), was being expanded when a section of the building gave way on Friday while workers were on site.

The exact number of workers and temple officials believed to be trapped beneath tonnes of rubble is unknown. While two people, a construction

Of the four deceased, one has been identified as Vickey Jairaj Panday, an executive member of the temple trust and manager of the construction project, local media reported, quoting officials. Panday had been deeply involved in the development of the temple since its inception nearly two years ago, the reports said. Sanvir Maharaj, director of Food for Love, a charity affiliated to the

temple, also confirmed that

a fifth body that had been located, had to suspend operations on Saturday afternoon due to inclement weather, Reaction Unit South Africa spokesperson Prem Balram told local media.

"At this stage, it cannot be confirmed whether additional individuals remain trapped beneath the rubble," he said. The temple was designed to resemble a cave, using rocks brought from India and excavated on site, and the family building the structure had claimed that it would house one of the world's largest deities of Lord Nrsimhadeva. The eThekwini municipality, in a statement, said no building plans had been approved for the project, suggesting

the construction was illegal.

Initial rescue efforts had been guided by cellphone calls from one of the trapped persons, but communications ceased late Friday evening, officials said.

KwaZulu-Natal Provincial Minister for Cooperative Governance and Traditional Affairs Thulasizwe Buthelezi visited the site on Saturday and pledged that rescue operations would continue for as long as necessary, even as experts noted that there was little hope of finding more survivors.

Buthelezi expressed gratitude to the combined government and private teams involved in the search and rescue operation, including a special dog unit from the Western Cape.

According to an FIR registered at Edachery police station, around 200 people marched towards the Congress office carrying weapons and vandalised the building, causing damage estimated at around Rs five lakh. A statue of the late Prime Minister Indira Gandhi was also damaged in the attack, police said. Soon



after, UDF activists gathered at the spot, further aggravating the situation. #### Messi to meet CJI and Army chief along with PM Modi in Delhi

Argentine football icon Lionel Messi will meet the Chief Justice of India and the Army chief at a member of Parliament's house after his visit to Prime Minister Narendra Modi's official residence during his Delhi leg of the India tour here Monday. The final day of the GOAT India Tour will also see Messi exchanging greetings with two members of the Indian cricket team at the Ferozshah Kotla Stadium.

It is understood that the member of parliament is Nationalist Congress Party (NCP) leader Praful Patel, who had served as president of the All India Football Federation (AIFF) for three terms. Messi will arrive in the national capital at 10.45am, and after a 50-minute 'Meet and Greet' session at a city hotel, he will head to the PM's residence where he will spend 20 minutes interacting with Modi.

His next stop will be the residence of an MP, where he is also set to meet the Argentina Ambassador to India Mariano Agustin Caucino, besides CJI Justice Surya Kant and Army chief general Upendra Dwivedi.

The chief of Enforcement Direc-

torate, Rahul Navin, is also likely to part of the select gathering at the MP's house, which will also comprise fee top government officials. After his meeting with the VVIPs, Messi's convoy will leave for the Ferozshah Kotla Stadium where a few programmes are lined up.

At 3.30pm, Messi is scheduled to enter the stadium via the walkway that leads to the pitch, where the cars will be ready to then leave from there directly to the airport once the GOAT concerts ends.

Following a grand welcome with music, Messi will head to the small soccer field where some Indian celebrities will be engaged in a match. Messi will greet the players, take group photo with teams.

A football clinic with 22 children will be held from 3.55pm to 4.15pm. Messi will then head to the centre of the field, and two Indian cricketers will give him a gift, and the Argentine footballer will hand over two pre-signed jersey to both.

### BENGAL GOVERNOR DENIED ENTRY TO SALT LAKE STADIUM AMID MESSI CHAOS

Kolkata: West Bengal Governor C V Ananda Bose was "denied" entry into the Salt Lake Stadium, after chaos and crowd trouble at the venue marred an event featuring football legend Lionel Messi.Bose described the denial of entry on Saturday evening as an affront to the constitutional position of the governor, and sought a reply from the authorities.

"I never write a report without seeing the spot... My report is half-ready. I want to see for myself what happened in Ground Zero," he told reporters outside the stadium. "Is this the way West Bengal treats its governor? The governor is not a rubber stamp," Bose said, terming the episode a "ghastly irrelevance of a constitutional authority".

Bose said he would revisit the stadium on Sunday and examine the issue in depth.

"It is not a personal affront... this is an affront to the constitutional position of the governor. If truth can be hidden from the governor, maybe this is only the tip of the iceberg. I will certainly explore it to the hilt and establish the truth," he asserted. The governor said the police had already begun an investigation and that his report would reflect "the point of view of the people who are affected". Chaos unfolded at the Salt Lake Stadium on Saturday, after spectators resorted to vandalism on failing to catch a glimpse of Messi, alleging gross mismanagement by the organisers and obstruction of view by VIPs.

Police arrested the event's main organiser, Satadru Datta, while Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee announced the constitution of a high-level inquiry committee to probe the incident. Bose had earlier dubbed the incident at the Salt Lake Stadium a "dark day for the sports-loving people of Kolkata".
