Telangana CM Revanth Reddy express shock over Ajit Pawar's demise

Hyderabad: Telangana Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy on Wednesday, January 28, expressed deep shock over the death of Maharashtra Deputy Chief Minister Ajit Pawar in a plane crash. Revanth Reddy, who is currently on a visit to the United States, expressed deep shock and profound grief over the tragic demise of Ajit Pawar. According to a statement from the Chief Minister's Office, he said Ajit Pawar's sudden passing is an irreparable loss to public life and extended heartfelt condolences to his family, the Government of Maharashtra, and the people of the state. CM Revanth Reddy prayed for strength to the bereaved family in this moment of immense sorrow. Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister Chandrababu Naidu, too, mourned the death of Ajit Pawar in the plane crash. IRAN WILL RESPOND 'LIKE NEVER BEFORE', UN MISSION WARNS AFTER TRUMP'S THREATS



Iran's mission to the United Nations has warned that the country will respond forcefully to any potential attack by the United States, after US President Donald Trump issued fresh threats suggesting he might pursue a military confrontation with Iran.

In a post on its X account on Wednesday, the mission said that Iran is prepared to resolve its disputes with the US through dialogue "based on mutual respect and interests", but insisted the country will

not hesitate to defend itself if attacked.

"BUT IF PUSHED, IT WILL DEFEND ITSELF AND RESPOND LIKE NEVER BEFORE!"

the post read.

Trump escalated his rhetoric about a potential military confrontation with Iran late on Tuesday, telling supporters that "another beautiful armada" of warships was "floating beautifully toward Iran."

He later published a post on his Truth Social platform, expressing hope that the deployment

of the warships would pressure Iran to return to negotiations over its nuclear program.

Trump warned that if Iran fails to reach a deal with the US, it will be attacked, adding that such an attack would be "far worse" than the strike on Iran's nuclear facilities in June.

Iran launched a barrage of missiles at the Al Udeid Air Base in Qatar, a facility that hosts US forces and equipment, in response to the attack on its nuclear facilities.

At 8:44 am, the ATC saw flames around Runway 11 with massive plumes of smoke caught on nearby CCTV cameras, showing the scale of the crash.

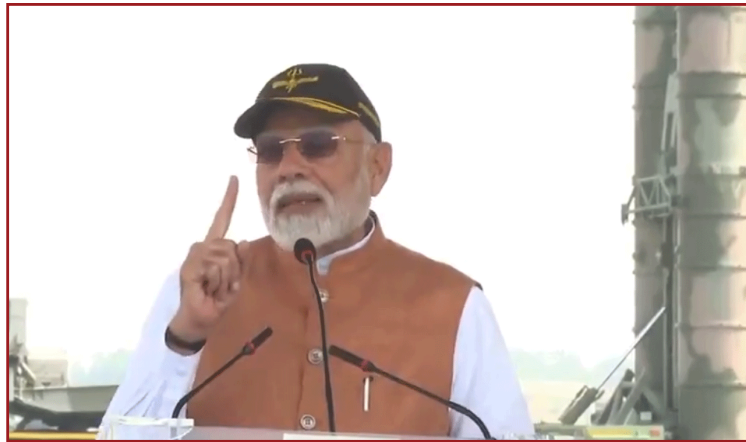
Mumbai: The Bombardier Learjet 45XR aircraft carrying Maharashtra Deputy Chief Minister Ajit Pawar and four others was reportedly attempting a second landing at the Baramati Airport when it crashed on Wednesday, January 28, the Ministry of Civil Aviation said. The plane left Mumbai at 8:10 am. The plane, owned by VSR Ventures Pvt Ltd, a Delhi-based non-scheduled air transport operator, left Mumbai at 8:10 am. At 8:18 am, the plane confirmed its contact with Baramati



Airport's Air Traffic Control (ATC). With a distance of 256 km, the flying time between Mumbai and Baramati is less than an hour. The aircraft contacted the

ATC when it was 30 nautical miles away from Baramati and heading towards it. Till that point, Pune Approach Control had cleared the aircraft from its radar-controlled

service. The pilots were then advised to continue landing on their own, since weather conditions were good for flying. Visibility poor, runway not in sight. During the final approach on Runway 11, the pilots reported that the runway was not in sight and initiated a go-around. Since their attempted landing was disrupted, they instead climbed back up instead of touching down. After the go-around, when asked about the aircraft's position, the pilots again reported that they were on the final approach to Runway 11.."



PM Modi to Address NCC Rally, Emphasizes 'Nation First'

New Delhi: Prime Minister Narendra Modi will address the annual National Cadet Corps (NCC) PM Rally on Wednesday at the Cariappa Parade Ground in Delhi, sharing his thoughts on nation first and character development. The NCC PM Rally will mark the grand culmination

of the month-long NCC Republic Day Camp 2026, which witnessed the participation of 2,406 cadets from across the country, including 898 girl cadets. Earlier, Defence Minister Rajnath Singh visited the camp and described NCC cadets as the nation's second line of defence.

"As a result of the policies of my government, the income of citizens has increased, their savings have grown, and their purchasing power has also improved," the President said.



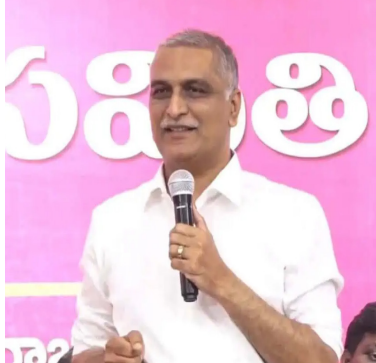

the economic foundation of the country has grown significantly stronger. Despite various global crises, India has remained the fastest-growing major economy in the world," Murmu said. She said India has further improved its record in keeping inflation under control. "It is directly benefiting the poor and middle-class families of the country. As a result of the policies of my government, the income of citizens has increased, their savings have grown and their purchasing power has also improved," the President said. GST 2.0 helped citizens save Rs 1 lakh crore. Murmu said her government is moving forward on the "Reforms Express" path and old rules and provisions are continually updated to meet future needs.

THIS GOVT WORKS FOR LIQUOR companies, neglects farmers: Harish Rao lashes out

Hyderabad: In a fresh attack on the ruling Congress government, former minister and senior Bharat Rashtra Samithi (BRS) leader Harish Rao said the administration had "opened the doors to fresh corruption" in the Telangana's Excise Department. During a "Chit Chat" programme at Telangana Bhavan, the Siddipet MLA claimed that licences for microbreweries and liquor outlets were allotted through political and ministerial quotas. "This is just an excise scam was another in a series of scandals that would be exposed, including those related to Singareni," he said. According to him, the Telangana Excise Department received 110 applications for microbrewery licences, of which 25 were allegedly earmarked under political quotas. "As many as 21 licences were kept aside under the quota of a key leader, while four were reserved under a



minister's quota," he said, without revealing the name. The Legislature Party Deputy Floor Leader also accused the government of issuing wine shop licences to select individuals without following the mandatory lucky draw process. "For the first time in the state's history, liquor supply companies are facing pending dues of nearly Rs 4,500 crore, with payments not released for the last 16 months," he said.

Iran, Saudi Arabia warn of 'dangerous consequences' of regional escalation

Iran and Saudi Arabia have warned of the "dangerous consequences" of any escalation of tensions for security and stability in West Asia, as the US military buildup near Iran continues. Iran's Foreign Minister Abbas Araghchi and his Saudi counterpart Faisal bin Farhan made the assertion in a phone call on Wednesday.
