

## TRUMP WILL NEVER DEFEAT IRANIAN NATION

: IRGC cmdr. highlights US strategic failure

A senior Islamic Revolution Guards Corps (IRGC) commander says US President Donald Trump has suffered a strategic failure, emphasizing that Washington's military apparatus can never defeat the resilient Iranian nation. IRGC's political deputy Brigadier General Yadollah Javani made the remarks on Thursday night while addressing thousands of people who took to the streets in Arak to voice support for the Islamic Republic against the US-Israeli aggression which began on February 28. Javani noted that the United States, the Zionist regime, and their allies wrongly believed a direct, full-scale assault would overwhelm Tehran in less than 48 hours. "Today, Trump wants to force the great Iranian nation to surrender, while God has blocked the path of the infidels' and falsehood's domination over the believers, and Trump does not understand it," Javani said.

## Bengaluru growth hit by airport curbs, Karnataka Dy CM tells

 Bengaluru: Karnataka Deputy Chief Minister DK Shivakumar on Friday, April 24, urged Defence Minister Rajnath Singh to reconsider the restrictions on the height of buildings around defence airports in the city. Shivakumar met Singh in New Delhi, where he held detailed discussions on the issue, according to a statement issued by the deputy CM's office. "Shivakumar raised concerns about the impact of these restrictions on development in several parts of the city and urged the defence minister to adopt a balanced approach that ensures aviation safety while supporting Bengaluru's growth," the statement said. In his letter to Singh, Shivakumar highlighted "the excessive restrictions" imposed by the authorities of defence airports in Bengaluru while granting No Objection Certificates (NOCs) for construction within a 20-km radius of the airports, as per the prevailing rules. "Bengaluru is one of the fastest-growing cities in the world.



## LEADER: REMARKABLE UNITY AMONG IRANIANS SHATTERS ENEMY RANKS

Leader of the Islamic Revolution Ayatollah Seyyed Mojtaba Khamenei praised the powerful effect of the national unity, emphasizing that Iranian people's solidarity has significantly undermined and shattered the enemy's ranks.

In a message republished on X account late on Thursday, the Leader wrote, "Due to the strange unity created among compatriots, a fracture has occurred in the enemy."

The unprecedented solidarity and unity among Iranian people disrupted the calculations of those seeking to undermine the Islamic Republic, the Leader highlighted.

Ayatollah Mojtaba Khamenei stressed the need to express gratitude for this divine blessing through concrete actions, affirming that such efforts will render national cohesion "greater and more steely," while leaving the enemies

"more wretched and diminished."

The Leader also drew attention to the enemy's ongoing psychological warfare, warning, "The enemy's media operations, by targeting the minds and psyches of the people, intend to undermine the national unity and security; may our negligence not allow this sinister intent to come to fruition."

Ayatollah Khamenei's message comes at a critical juncture as the Islamic Republic of Iran stands resilient against multifaceted aggressions, including sanctions, threats, and propaganda campaigns orchestrated by the United States, the Zionist regime and their Western allies.

Earlier on Thursday, the three heads of Iran's executive, legislative, and judicial branches issued a collective response to US President Donald Trump, denouncing his remarks about "divisions between extremists and moderates" in Iran as unwarranted provocations.

## Telangana to implement revised land market values from May: Deputy CM

Deputy Chief Minister Mallu Bhatti Vikramarka said the government's Hyderabad Industrial Lands Transformation (HILT) policy will be implemented democratically.

Telangana Deputy Chief Minister Mallu Bhatti Vikramarka on Friday, April 24, said the government's Hyderabad Industrial Lands Transformation (HILT) policy will be implemented democratically, assuring industrialists that no one will be put to inconvenience.

Chairing a Revenue Resource Mobilisation Cabinet Sub-Committee meeting at the Dr BR Ambedkar Secretariat in Hyderabad, Bhatti said the policy has been framed keeping in mind the interests of both Hyderabad city and the state at large.

The meeting was attended by ministers Uttam Kumar Reddy, Sridhar Babu and Jupally Krish-



narao, along with representatives of industrial estates.

The Sub-Committee directed Registration Department officials to implement revised land market values from the first week of May. Bhatti warned that officials who show negligence in implementing resource mobilisation decisions will not be

spared.

On the HILT policy, the Deputy CM said the government is open to accommodating the views of industrial estate representatives before finalising the guidelines. He suggested that all industrial associations within the Outer Ring Road (ORR) be consulted to accelerate imple-

mentation.

Though some industrial estate representatives themselves acknowledged that making it compulsory to shift polluting industries beyond the ORR would prompt all of them to relocate, Bhatti said the government is nevertheless proceeding by taking all opinions into account.

He also said that under the Undeveloped Land (UDL) policy, the central government, state government and industrial park representatives should jointly explore land development. He welcomed suggestions from representatives to set up dedicated industrial parks between the ORR and the Regional Ring Road on the lines of China, saying a decision will be taken after due consideration.

## FINGERS ON TRIGGER Target bank ready': Iran warns US of 'eye for head' reprisal

Iranian officials have said that their fingers remain on the trigger with a designated bank of targets, warning the United States of a devastating "eye for a head" reprisal if it resumes its military aggression.

The warnings follow renewed threats from US President Donald Trump to destroy Iranian civilian infrastructure, such as bridges and power plants if Tehran rejects his terms during the current fragile



ceasefire. The commanders of the Islamic Revolution Guards Corps (IRGC) Aerospace and Navy forces issued

a joint message late on Thursday, underscoring the nation's readiness and unyielding unity.

"The bank of targets is specified, fingers are on the trigger, and our backing is the unity of the streets and the cohesion of officials," the commanders wrote.

They vowed to make the "criminal aggressor" regret its actions through the iron unity of the state and the people, adding, "One God, one Leader, one nation, and one path; and that is the path of victory for an Iran dearer than life."

## Hezbollah MP: Ceasefire meaningless amid ongoing Israeli aggression

A senior Hezbollah legislator says no ceasefire agreement can hold as long as the Israeli regime continues its military aggression, assassinations, and the systematic destruction of Lebanon's border towns. Ali Fayaz said on Friday that no ceasefire can take effect while Lebanon's sovereignty is violated by persistent "shelling and gunfire." He said the resistance group will not accept a truce that allows for the continued destruction of the Lebanese border towns.

Fayaz made the remarks after US President Donald Trump announced the extension of a formerly agreed ceasefire for three more weeks on April 23. "The resistance reaffirms its rejection of and confrontation with the US track that seeks to bind Lebanon to a ceasefire without.

## India can't be Vishwaguru until Muslims get justice: Asaduddin Owaisi



Bhuj: All India Majlis-e-Ittehadul Muslimeen (AIMIM) chief Asaduddin Owaisi on Thursday, April 23, said that India cannot become a "Vishwaguru" (guide to the world) unless Muslims in the country get justice, as he urged voters in Bhuj to strengthen political leadership within the community ahead of the local body polls. Addressing a public meeting in Bhuj town, Owaisi said the vision of India as a global leader would remain incomplete without justice and equality for minorities. "If this country is to become a Vishwaguru or a superpower, it cannot happen until Muslims of India get their rights," he asserted. He appealed to voters to support AIMIM candidates contesting in the Bhuj municipality and various taluka panchayats of the district. "Use your precious vote to strengthen our political leadership in Bhuj, Kutch and across Gujarat," he said.

Targeting rival parties, Owaisi alleged that both the BJP and Congress, along with the RSS, "spread lies" about AIMIM. He maintained that his party's objective was to strengthen democracy and reinforce public faith in the Constitution. Invoking the Constitution drafted by Dr B R Ambedkar, Owaisi said its core principles — liberty, equality, justice and fraternity — would remain "mere words on paper" unless minorities developed their own leadership.

## KCR WELCOMES JEEVAN REDDY INTO BRS, MAKES HIM GENERAL SECRETARY

Hyderabad, Apr, 20 (TDN) : Former Congress minister and MLC T Jeevan Reddy joined Bharat Rashtra Samithi (BRS) in the presence of party chief and Gajwel MLA K Chandrasekhar Rao (KCR) at the "BRS Praja Ashirwada Sabha" held in Jagtial on Monday, April 20. Addressing the public meeting, KCR appointed Jeevan Reddy as the party's general secretary with immediate effect and promised to give him a prominent position if BRS came to power. KCR urged Jeevan Reddy to concentrate on Adilabad, Nizamabad and other neighbouring districts, leaving the fight in Jagtial to his followers in the constituency. "When we met a few days ago, I told Jeevan Reddy that we would work like brothers in a family, like pillars of the party," he said, assuring that BRS will come to power by 100 per cent. He praised the veteran politician as a leader with a large following not just in Jagtial, but also in Choppadandi, Dharmapuri, Koratla, Peddapalli and other constituencies.

## TELANGANA HC ACQUITS TOP BRS LEADERS IN 2011 MILLION MARCH VIOLENCE CASE

The Telangana High Court on Friday, April 24, quashed the cases lodged against Bharat Rashtra Samithi (BRS) Chief K Chandrasekhar Rao, its

working president KT Rama Rao (KTR) and Siddipet MLA T Harish Rao in connection with the violence and vandalism that happened during the Million March for Telangana's statehood held on March 10, 2011.

The three leaders had filed

separate quash petitions challenging the cases lodged over their alleged involvement in the massive protest on March 31 this year. Hearing the petitions, Justice K Sujana had issued notices to the state government and the complainants, directing them to

submit their responses.

The High Court had reserved its verdict after the hearing on April 9, when the counsel appearing for the BRS leaders argued that they had no role to play in the incident, and that they were not even present at the scene when the violence took place.

The Million March was organised by pro-Telangana groups led by the Telangana Joint Action Committee (TJAC), including political parties, student unions and civil society organisations, with the aim of mobilising large-scale public support for the bifurcation of the state in Hyderabad.

Protesters gathered at the Tank Bund despite strict police restrictions, turning the event into a powerful display of dissent. At least 15 statues of freedom fighters and literary legends, mostly belonging to the Andhra region, were damaged by the furious protesters.

## Telangana High Court Verdict: Big Blow to Unemployed, Distance Education Degrees Not Valid for Govt Jobs

Hyderabad, Apr, 24 (TDN): In a major development, the Telangana High Court has ruled that degrees obtained through distance education study centres of universities from other states are not valid for government jobs in Telangana. The verdict came while hearing a case related to Telangana Public Service Commission (TGPSC) recruitment, dealing a significant blow to candidates. The ruling is now in effect and impacts ongoing and future recruitment processes. The High Court clearly stated that degrees obtained through study centres run by universities outside their territorial jurisdiction are not valid for government employment. Universities established under state laws must operate within their state boundaries. Setting up study centres in other states violates rules
