Mullanpur: The cricketing world once again bowed down to the generational talent of Vaibhav Sooryavanshi following his six-laden 97 off 29 balls before Jofra Archer broke the backbone of Sunrisers Hyderabad's muscular batting to set up a 47-run win for Rajasthan Royals in the IPL Eliminator here on Wednesday. ONLINE FRAUD TARGETING PATIENTS AND FAMILIES WARNED

Fraudsters are increasingly targeting patients and their families who are already under severe mental, physical, and financial stress during illness and treatment.

In a recent incident, the husband of a hospitalized patient was contacted by unknown individuals who claimed they could help arrange charitable funds and Zakat donations from

overseas, particularly from generous donors in the United States. The scammers convinced him that opening a new bank account was necessary to receive the funds, and that an initial deposit was required to process the transfer. Trusting their claims due to financial pressure from ongoing medical expenses, the victim transferred money in multiple transactions via Google Pay, including ₹35,000, ₹10,000, ₹2,000,



and ₹2,000, totaling approximately ₹49,000. Later, when he attempted to verify the promised assistance and fund transfer, he discovered that he had fallen victim to a coordinated online fraud.

He subsequently approached the police and filed a complaint. Authorities have issued Acknowledgement No. 33706260024971, and an investigation is currently underway to trace those involved. Social activists and community members have expressed serious concern over such

incidents, stating that exploiting the vulnerability of patients and their families is highly unethical and inhumane. They noted that due to the high cost of treatment in major corporate and multi-specialty hospitals, many families seek financial assistance, which scammers are now misusing by offering

fake donation, Zakat, and aid schemes.

The public has been urged to verify any claims of financial assistance before transferring money. Experts advise that genuine donation drives should always use verified bank accounts or QR codes belonging to the patient or their close family members to ensure safe and transparent transactions. Authorities have appealed to citizens to remain vigilant against such online frauds and to immediately report suspicious activity to the police or cyber-crime units to prevent others from becoming victims.

OWAISI URGES DHARMENDRA PRADHAN TO POSTPONE DU EXAMS ON BAKRID



Hyderabad: All India Majlis-e-Ittehadul Muslimeen (AIM-IM) chief Asaduddin Owaisi on Wednesday, May 27, called on Education Minister Dharmendra Pradhan to intervene and postpone Delhi University's exams scheduled on Eid al-Adha on May 28, adding that the university is showing a "biased attitude" towards Muslim minorities.

"Sir Dharmendra Pradhan, kindly ensure that the exams are postponed. Delhi University is showing a biased attitude towards Muslim minorities. Will they also say the same thing when festivals of other communities are celebrated?" Owaisi wrote on X. He shared a video of university students protesting outside the campus.

On Wednesday, May 27, a student moved the Delhi High Court challenging the institution's decision, even as a public holiday was declared by the Union government.

PETA Should Not Interfere in Muharram Religious Traditions: Asghar Farshouri

Janab Asghar Farshouri, President of Anjuman-e-Syed-us-Sajdeen, strongly reacted to recent remarks regarding Muharram processions and said that PETA should not interfere in our religious matters and traditional activities. He said that every year before Muharram, objections are raised targeting the religious traditions of the community, which deeply hurt the sentiments of azadars. Muharram processions in

Hyderabad have a centuries-old history and are observed with discipline, devotion, and respect. Asghar Farshouri questioned that if PETA is truly concerned about animal welfare, then why does it repeatedly focus only on Muharram. He asked why similar objections are not raised regarding other cultural activities, films, and industries where animals are also used. He said selective criticism of Muharram traditions is unfair and unacceptable.

HM Amit Shah reviews security in Rajasthan, calls for '360-Degree Grid' along India-Pak border

Union Home and Cooperation Minister Amit Shah chaired a high-level security review meeting in Rajasthan's Bikaner to assess and strengthen security arrangements along the India-Pakistan International Border, officials said on Wednesday.

During the meeting, Union Minister Shah emphasised that under the leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, the Union government is committed to ensuring the highest standards of security along the international borders.

He stressed the need for enhanced coordination between central agencies and the state government to strengthen border management and maintain internal security. A key decision taken



during the meeting was the formulation of a "360-degree security grid" for every border district. The framework aims to ensure

coordinated participation of local residents, state government machinery, and all security agencies to create a more comprehensive

and effective border management system. The Union Home Minister directed strict enforcement of a zero-tolerance policy against illegal constructions and instructed authorities to demolish all unauthorised structures located within a 15-km radius of the International Border. He also instructed officials to effectively utilise the '1930' cybercrime helpline for prompt response to cyber-related offences and stressed the need for robust implementation of the country's three new criminal laws to strengthen law enforcement and judicial processes.
