

RAHUL, PRIYANKA & AKHILESH DETAINED AS NEET PROTEST REACHES PM’S RESIDENCE



According to PTI, Delhi Police forcibly removed and detained Rahul Gandhi, Priyanka Gandhi Vadra, and SP chief Akhilesh Yadav from the protest site outside Prime Minister Narendra Modi’s residence on Tuesday. Rahul Gandhi, along with several Congress leaders, including the Chief Ministers of Karnataka and Kerala, began a sit-in protest at around 3:30 pm near the Prime Minister’s residence. IRGC declares ‘dark night for US radars Army strikes three bases in Kuwait

The Islamic Revolution Guards Corps (IRGC) says it has destroyed multiple US military radar and communications facilities in the region, while the Army reports drone strikes on three US bases in Kuwait in ongoing retaliation for American violations.

The announcements were made in a series of statements issued early Tuesday, describing the latest phases of the IRGC’s Operation Nasr- (Victory) 2 and the Army’s Operation Sa’eqeh (Lightning) in response to the United States’ renewed aggression against the Islamic Republic. In its first statement, the IRGC said the second phase of wave 24 of Operation Nasr-2 targeted infrastructure supporting US military

air defense operations in Kuwait. The Corps said the latest phase was staged “to clear the way by eliminating obstacles to large-scale air and missile operations” against American targets in the region. According to the statement, missiles and drones struck and destroyed a long-range radar site, a communications center, satellite reception systems, and a missile defense radar belonging to the “child-killing US military” stationed

in Kuwait. The IRGC also said an MQ-9 drone hangar at Ali al-Salem Airbase was hit in the country, adding that several drones were either destroyed or severely damaged as a result. Addressing the Iranian nation, the Corps vowed, “The punitive operation carried out by your sons [in the IRGC] continues.” In a second statement issued later, the IRGC said it had carried out another strike against US air



defense assets at Ahmad al-Jaber Airbase in Kuwait. The statement said an early warning radar, a missile defense radar system, an

FPS-117 radar, a Patriot air defense system, and a satellite communications system supporting air defense operations were struck and destroyed.

Punjab farmers march towards Delhi against India-US deal, stopped

They claimed that the proposed trade deal would allow cheaper agricultural imports into India, affecting domestic farm incomes and the country’s agricultural economy.

Shambhu/Ambala/New Delhi: Hundreds of Punjab farmers on their way to Delhi to take part in the Kisan Mahapanchayat to protest against the proposed India-US trade deal were stopped at the Shambhu border on Tuesday, July 21, as Haryana Police erected barricades and placed cement blocks at the entry point to the neighbouring state. So far, at least four farmers were detained by Delhi Police at the Singhu border between Haryana and the national capital, sources

said. A day-long “Kisan Mahapanchayat” is being organised at Kisan Ghat in Delhi under the banner of “Desh Bachao Morcha”. The farmers’ convoy departed from Gurdwara Sri Fatehgarh Sahib on Tuesday morning. They had spent Monday night at the sarai (pilgrims’ inn) of the gurdwara. From the gurdwara, they reached Madhopur, near Sirhind on the GT Road, and then proceeded towards Shambhu. Carrying flags of their organisations, hundreds of farmers from across

Punjab gathered at the Shambhu border in the morning to proceed towards the national capital in buses to take part in the protest but were denied entry to Haryana. As part of the plan, around a thousand farmers from Punjab were to travel to Delhi in buses. Scores of farmers were stopped at the Khanauri border point, Shahabad in Kurukshetra and Karnal as well, their leaders said. In Kurukshetra, farmers claimed that they were stopped near Jyotisar.

Two violating oil tankers halted after massive fires in Strait of Hormuz

The Islamic Revolution Guards Corps (IRGC) says two oil tankers that attempted to transit an unsafe route south of the Strait of Hormuz were stopped after explosions triggered major fires, slamming the US military for misleading the vessels. In a statement in the early hours of Tuesday, the IRGC said the two oil tankers violating maritime regulations were halted after suffering explosions and large-scale fires following their attempt

to enter and exit via the unsafe and accident-prone southern route of the Strait of Hormuz. “A short while ago, two violating oil tankers that, after being misled by the child-killing US military, intended to pass through the dangerous route south of the Strait of Hormuz suffered explosions that caused extensive fires and brought them to a halt. Rescue and relief units are currently evacuating the crews of these vessels from the area,” the state-

ment read. The IRGC also issued a renewed warning to international shipping companies, urging them not to rely on US military guidance regarding navigation through the strategic waterway. “The IRGC Navy once again warns shipping companies to safeguard the safety of their crews and vessels, not to trust the false information provided by the US military, and to avoid unsafe and hazardous routes,” it stressed.

CM REVANTH REDDY CRACKS DOWN ON DELAYS AT HAKIMPET EDUCATION HUB, WARNS OFFICIALS

Telangana Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy inspected the Hakimpet Education Hub in Vikarabad, ordered faster construction, warned negligent officials of suspension, and directed plot pattas to be distributed by next week.

Hyderabad: Telangana Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy has directed officials to speed up construction work at the Education Hub in Hakimpet, Vikarabad district, warning that officials showing negligence could face suspension. During an on-site inspection, the Chief Minister reviewed the progress of educational institutions and development works, announced that he would personally inspect

Hyderabad protest against Delhi police action on demonstrators today

CJP leaders have accused the Delhi Police of using excessive force without provocation during Monday’s march, insisting the demonstration was peaceful.

Two gatherings are planned in the city on Tuesday, July 21, after police used tear gas and baton charges against demonstrators at Delhi’s Jantar Mantar a day earlier, during the Cockroach Janata Party’s (CJP) “Chalo Sansad” march to Parliament. The Disha Students’ Organisation and Naujawan Bharat Sabha have called a protest titled “Rise in Rage!”

at People’s Plaza, Necklace Road, at 5:30 pm, describing it as a citizens’ protest against police brutality on protesters in Delhi. A separate indoor gathering, “In Solidarity with Protestors,” is scheduled at the Somajiguda Press Club from 3 pm to 6 pm, with former IAS officer Akunuri Murali expected to join what organisers describe as a stand for student accountability in education.

What protesters say happened in Delhi CJP leaders have accused



the Delhi Police of using excessive force without provocation during Monday’s march, insisting the demonstration was peaceful. The party said several students were injured, and that Sonam Wangchuk’s wife, Gitanjali J Angmo, was pushed around during the crackdown near Jantar Mantar.

Videos circulating online reportedly show police personnel themselves throwing stones toward protesters, contradicting the police’s version of events. At least 50-60 protesters were severely injured needing immediate medical care. Samajwadi Party MP Dimple Yadav said students had been beaten and called it a black day for democracy and history, adding that some police personnel appeared visibly uncomfortable and removed their name badges before stepping forward to act.

BRS PRESSES CENTRE ON ACCOUNTABILITY, EDUCATION

Hyderabad: Bharat Rashtra Samithi (BRS) working president K.T. Rama Rao on Tuesday said that it is high time for the Centre to address the demand for accountability and education reforms. The BRS leader said he had predicted a Gen Z protest in the country. “About 10 months ago, I had made a comment at a media event that a Gen-Z protest is imminent in our country if the aspirations of youngsters are not addressed. After yesterday’s Delhi protest, it is high time for the Union Govt to address the demand for accountability and education reforms,” Rama Rao posted on ‘X’ KTR, as the BRS leader is popularly known, earlier condemned the police ac-



tion against the protesters, terming it ‘undemocratic’ and ‘shameful’. “Delhi Police lathicharge peaceful, unarmed protesters is extremely undemocratic and shameful. You cannot answer questions with lathis and tear gas The Constitution gives every citizen the right to question. That right cannot be beaten out of us. I strongly condemn this,” said the former minister.
