MASS TURNOUT AT LEADER'S FUNERAL A 'DECISIVE' RESPONSE TO BULLYING, TERROR

Iranian President Masoud Pezeshkian says a massive public turnout at the funeral of late Leader of the Islamic Revolution Ayatollah Seyyed Ali Khamenei will serve as a "decisive" response to terrorism, violence and bullying, while demonstrating the Iranian nation's unity and determination to defend its independence and dignity. Pezeshkian made the remark in a message on Thursday addressed to the Iranian nation ahead of farewell and burial ceremonies for the late Ayatollah Khamenei, who was martyred on February 28, the first day of the US-Israel imposed war. "Your huge presence is a decisive response to terror, violence, and bullying, and a clear message to the world showing that the Iranian nation stands united and unanimous in defending their independence and dignity," he said. It will also demonstrate that "no incident will weaken the will of this nation to build a prosperous, free, powerful, and proud Iran", he added. He expressed confidence in the people's role at the current juncture and noted that the Iranian nation will once again reaffirm its loyalty to the path and ideals of the martyred Leader in this grand farewell. He commended the late Leader's thought and performance in safeguarding Iran's independence and promoting religious democracy and resistance during some of the most challenging periods in the country's modern history.

European anti-imperialist groups arrive in Iran for Martyr Leader's funeral



A caravan of anti-imperialist activists, academics, journalists, and representatives of Islamic centers from across Europe are traveling to Tehran to participate in the funeral procession of the martyred Leader of the Islamic Revolution Ayatollah Seyyed Ali Khamenei. The groups, which include members of Italy's anti-imperialist axis, researchers, university professors, journalists, anti-war union representatives, and supporters of the Islamic Revolution, have begun arriving in Iran despite the absence of official invitations from European governments, IRNA reported Thursday. One diplomatic source said the funeral procession for Imam Khamenei has drawn activists and intellectuals from across Europe who want to express solidarity with the Iranian people and their resistance against the 'great and small Satan' alliance. The delegation includes figures who view the late Leader as a symbol of independence, anti-hegemony, and support for oppressed nations over decades. A second diplomatic source confirmed that visas have been issued for representatives from Islamic centers and institutions in the Netherlands,

JAPANESE FIRMS SET TO ANNOUNCE INVESTMENTS WORTH ABOUT \$12.5 BILLION IN INDIA



As Japanese Prime Minister Sanae Takaichi began her three-day India visit, Japanese companies are set to announce investments worth nearly \$12.5 billion (around 2 trillion yen) in the country. More than 150 Japanese companies are participating in the Japan-India Economic Forum alongside the summit. The investment commitment is part of the broader commitment announced last year to facilitate 10 trillion yen in private Japanese investments in India over a decade. In a post on X, Japan's Deputy Chief Cabinet Secretary Masanao Ozaki, who arrived in New Delhi along with PM Takaichi, noted that over 150 companies will be participating in the Japan-India Economic Forum. In the post, Masanao added a report by Japanese newspaper The Yomiuri Shimbun, which noted that these initiatives, valued at approximately 2 trillion yen on the Japanese side, aim to deepen their footprint in India and Japan are expected to explore joint stockpiling initiatives to strengthen energy security. Defense cooperation is also expected to receive a mega boost. In a big push for the 'Make in India' initiative, Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Takaichi are set to jointly inaugurate Maruti Suzuki India's new manufacturing plant at Kharkhoda in Haryana.

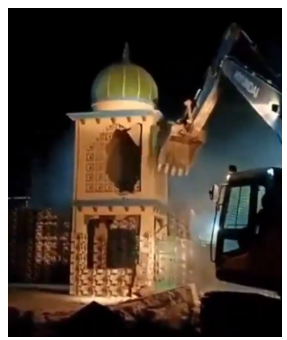
ARMY CHIEF: IRANIAN NATION WILL NEVER SURRENDER TO ENEMIES

The chief of the Iranian Army has called on the public to participate in a "historic and epic" farewell ceremony for martyred Leader of the Islamic Revolution Ayatollah Seyyed Ali Khamenei, declaring that the Iranian nation will never surrender to its enemies. In a statement on Thursday, Major General Amir Hatami described the martyrdom of Ayatollah Khamenei at the hands of the US and Israel as a "great tragedy" for the Iranian nation, Muslims worldwide, and free people everywhere. He said the enemies mistakenly believed they could break the will of the Iranian people through the crime, but instead found a nation more determined and united than ever. "The martyred Leader and Commander-in-Chief, throughout his honorable life, presented a complete model of courage, insight, and steadfastness against the excesses of global arrogance to all free people of the world," the statement read. "This great mujahid, until his final moments, safeguarded the path of resistance with courage and insight and never wavered from the path of truth," he added. The Army chief urged the public to participate in the farewell and funeral ceremonies to renew their pledge to the martyred Leader's path and the ideals of the Islamic Revolution. He said their presence will send a clear message to enemies and remind global arrogance that the Leader's path will continue with the "steel will" of the Iranian nation under the wise leadership of his successor, Ayatollah Seyyed Mojtaba Khamenei.

ISRAEL'S LARGEST REFINERIES FACE YEARS OF REPAIR AFTER IRAN AIRSTRIKES: REPORT

Israel's largest oil refineries have sustained far heavier damage from retaliatory Iranian missile strikes during the latest round of US-Israeli aggression against Iran than Israeli authorities previously acknowledged, Israeli media reports say. Israel's Channel 12 News reported that the refineries in Haifa Bay, in the north of the occupied territories sustained severe damage after two separate Iranian strikes earlier this year. One oil derivatives storage tank struck during an attack in March is beyond repair. The refineries had also sustained damage last year, during Israel's 12-day war of aggression against Iran. It said three Bazaran employees were killed after Iranian missiles pierced the US-backed Iron Dome mobile air defense system in June 2025. The report further said that the ministry of interior has now approved large-scale reconstruction works, which are expected to be completed in 2028.

MOSQUE DEMOLITIONS IN GUJARAT, VARANASI SPARK DEBATE

Religious structures in Kutch district, Gujarat, and Varanasi, Uttar Pradesh, have become the center of fresh controversy after demolition drives involving mosques and other religious sites. Authorities say the actions are part of anti-en-

croachment measures and development projects, while affected persons and Muslim organisations have questioned whether constitutional safeguards, legal procedures, and due process were fully followed. The developments have intensified a nationwide debate over religious freedom, equal application of the law, and constitutional rights. Religious Places Hold Deep Emotional and Historical Significance Places of worship are not merely buildings made of bricks and stones. They represent faith, history, culture, and the memories of generations. When a religious structure is demolished, it affects not only the building itself but also the emotions, religious attachment, and collective memories of the people associated with it. Over the past few years, legal disputes and demolition drives involving mosques and other religious places have repeatedly made headlines across India. Following the Babri Masjid case and the Bhojshala-Kamal Maula Mosque dispute, in which the site was handed over to Hindus, judicial and administrative proceedings involving various religious sites have sparked fresh public debate.

TELANGANA CABINET CLEARS MUSI PHASE-I, 6,278 TIMS JOBS

Telangana Cabinet Clears Musi Phase-I, 6,278 TIMS Jobs

The Telangana Cabinet, chaired by Chief Minister Revanth Reddy, on Thursday approved a series of major decisions, including implementation of the VB-GRAM G Act from July 1, 2026, while deciding to challenge its provisions in the Supreme Court. The Cabinet also approved 6,278 posts for new TIMS Super Speciality Hospitals, Rs.7,345.12 crore for Musi River Front Development Phase-I, extension of free breakfast and mid-day meals to teachers and staff, and land allotments for warehouses and central educational institutions. Telangana Cabinet Decides to Implement VB-GRAM G, Plans Supreme Court Challenge

The Cabinet discussed the implementation of the VB-GRAM G Act introduced by the Central Government. It expressed strong objection to several provisions of the Act, stating that the Centre introduced it without consulting the states. The Cabinet recalled that the Telangana Legislative Assembly had already passed a resolution in January opposing changes to the Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Scheme (MGNREGA) and had sent it to the Centre. The Cabinet decided to once again communicate its protest to the Central Government. Cabinet Sub-Committee Recommendations

The Cabinet discussed recommendations submitted by the Cabinet Sub-Committee headed by Minister Uttam Kumar Reddy. Considering the need to ensure employment for MGNREGA workers, the Cabinet approved the issuance of a notification implementing the VB-GRAM G Act in Telangana with effect from July 1, 2026.
